I hereby make application to enter the Cowley County L.E.A.D Contest.

I understand that exhibitors must be at least 10 years of age before January 1 of the current 4-H year. Exhibitors should not have reached 19 before January 1 of the current year to be eligible to participate.

Participants must have a finalized 4-H enrollment by the application submission and deadline

I understand that this is a huge learning and leadership opportunity. If I am chosen for the L.E.A.D program. A key component of this program is not only successfully raise a market (sheep, meat goat or swine), attend clinics, workshops and tours, be active in your club/community but also have initiative and drive to seek further knowledge, research and training on their own, utilize mentors and work together with current applicants and 4-H youth

I understand that if I am awarded to be a participant, I will be awarded a mini grant of \$500 to go towards your 2025 Market sheep, meat goat or swine project (which ever specie you are selected for). Participant will be required to tag one animal for the L.E.A.D program on the set Cowley County tagging dates (April

27th or 29th). If an animal is not tagged for the County Fair on time you will be held responsible for refunding the full \$500 immediately.

If I should receive the mini grant in my respective specie, I will be responsible for feeding, handling, and caring for the animal next year to the best of my ability. It is agreed and understood that the responsibility for the animal and its actions shall rest with the 4-H L.E.A.D participants.

Special Prizes will be awarded to L.E.A.D exhibitors. The animal must be exhibited in the market class and <u>must</u> be sold in the premium sale at the Cowley County Fair. It is the exhibitor's

responsibility to private treaty, market and sell the meat. Processing should be completed at Walnut Valley or Burden Meats unless further instructed. With carcass evaluations to follow fair. Once a participant has exhibited the youth will be ineligible to apply the for the program in the future.

I understand if the animal is NOT shown in the 2025 Cowley County Fair due to health issues exhibitor is expected to pay back 50% of purchase price and 75% if the animal is NOT shown due to lack of proper management in feeding and preparing the animal to show. This is to be determined by the House committee on case by case instances.

All premium money won will belong to the member. When the calf is sold, the check for payment will be sent after a final thank-you letter is sent to the sponsor *and* a copy is received by the Cowley County Extension Office.

Exhibitors will be expected to send a total of 5 sponsor report letters along with a **copy** of this letter sent to the Cowley County Extension Office or slag11@ksu.edu. *Letters must be postmarked or emailed by the listed date below. Failure to write the required letters may result in forfeiture of the mini grant.* Each member must complete a 4-H project record book for the animal, including a personal narrative essay, pictures, financial/feed details, sponsor letters and activities list for the entire project. A complete record must be kept and will be exhibited at the 2025 Cowley County Fair.

The House Committee reserves the right to retract the mini grant in full from any member who does not abide by the L.E.A.D Rules and Regulations including but not limited to the failure to write, send, and submit a copy of the scheduled sponsor letters, failure to maintain accurate records, failure to provide adequate care and/or feed to the animal, or failure to take full responsibility for the welfare of the animal. If any mini grant is retracted, no allowances will be made for any expenses incurred.

We are excited to introduce the L.E.A.D Program! This is a small specie mini grant program focusing on emerging Leaders, Empowering youth with Accountability and positive Development Opportunities. This opportunity comes from the generous donations of the House Foundation.

This program will be closely mirroring the Catch-A-Calf program. It will be available to Sheep, Swine and Meat Goat projects. Mini grants of \$500 will be awarded to the selected participants to go towards their market project. Participants will be held to a higher standard to become more knowledgeable about the industry, grow as leaders in their clubs and communities, and push themselves to the next level. Their projects will be exhibited at the Cowley County Fair and sold in the Premium Sale.
